# Brazilian firearms and ammunition referendum, 2005

On October 23, 2005, Brazil held a country-wide **referendum** on article 35 of the **Disarmament Statute** to determine whether to approve or disapprove the article, which states in full, "The sale of **firearms** and **ammunition** is prohibited in the entire national territory, except to those entities provided in article 6 of this Law." ("Art. 35. É proibida a comercialização de arma de fogo e munição em todo o território nacional, salvo para as entidades previstas no art. 6º desta Lei."<sup>[1]</sup>) The referendum failed by nearly  $\frac{2}{3}$  and that part of the statute was not enacted.

The referendum and its date had been provided by the Disarmament Statute itself (art. 35, §1º).<sup>[1]</sup> During the drafting and development of the law, it had been decided that article 35 should be submitted to a referendum because of the importance of its subject. On July 7, 2005, the **Federal Senate of Brazil** promulgated legislative decree 780, which authorized the referendum. Article 2 of its decree stipulated that the public consultation should employ the following question: "Should commerce in firearms and ammunition be prohibited in Brazil?" ("O comércio de armas de fogo e munição deve ser proibido no Brasil?")<sup>[2]</sup>
